Navy Team Report

Home from Texas. Back to Texas. Hoping for the same result.

Navy scored an impressive 63-14 win at Rice last week and goes right back to Texas to visit SMU this week. The Midshipmen are looking for their fourth straight win, putting the pieces of track together and building toward a seventh straight bowl game.

The trip isn't as daunting as others on the Navy schedule—Ohio State, Notre Dame—but SMU can run out a better overall product than the Mids saw from Rice.

“This is going to be a tough game for us. SMU is coming off a big win versus East Carolina and is playing very well right now,” said Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo. “I have great respect for Coach Jones and he has done a great job of turning around that program. You can see the mentality of the team changing.”

Veteran coach June Jones took over at SMU last year and the Mustangs won one game. They then opened this season 2-0, blew a game at Washington State, the first of two straight losses, before the big Conference USA win over East Carolina.

“I think the players are starting to learn June more and have a better understanding of his philosophy,” Niumatalolo said. “It's pretty obvious on tape that they are more comfortable offensively. (SMU) returned a lot of players and they are executing much better after having a year in the system.”

#### NOTES, QUOTES

- There have been multiple reports that former president George W. Bush will attend this week's game. Navy and SMU play for the first Frank Gansz Trophy, and Bush could well attend to present the winner the spoils. Gansz played at Navy and coached at both schools. He was entering his second year as SMU's special teams coach when he died suddenly back on April 27.

- Navy is 34-3 in the last 37 games in which it scored first in a game.

- QB Ricky Dobbs has scored at least one touchdown in all seven of his career starts.

- Navy beat SMU, 38-7, in a driving rainstorm at Annapolis last year.

- The Mids started 1-2 for the third straight season and have gone on a three-game winning streak each year. They failed to get the fourth straight win each of the previous two seasons and go for it Saturday night.

- The Mids have won 30 straight games when holding the opposition to 20 points or less.

- Correcting a note from last week, the 49-point margin of victory last week was Navy's largest since a 51-0 win over Army, Dec, 1, 1973.

- Ken Niumatalolo is 12-8 as a head coach.

Series History: SMU leads, 7-5 (last meeting, 2008, Navy 3-7).

Scouting The Offense: After a week of criticism for running their fullbacks on almost every play, Navy opened up the playbook at Rice last week, to tremendous results as the offense scored touchdowns on its first nine possessions. Navy, looking for its fifth straight national rushing title, moved up from No. 8 to No. 6 in the country last week. The Mids, as you probably know, are close to the bottom in passing (seven tries the last two weeks), and are 34th in scoring offense and 69th in total offense. They are 36th in the land inside the red zone.

Scouting The Defense: The Mids entered last week's game actually down four nose guards, counting

projected starter Nate Frazier, kicked off the team before the start of the season. End Mike Walsh moved over to the middle and played well, the latest contribution to what seems to be a growing defense. Navy is 29th in the country against the run, 44th against the pass, 32nd in total defense, 36th in scoring defense and 35th inside the red zone.

Quote To Note: “It was good to get that bitter taste out of our mouths and hopefully it was a starting point to continue moving forward. We worked really hard in practice last week to get some things corrected and it paid off. I thought we executed really well.”—Navy quarterback Ricky Dobbs after his team shook off a shaky offensive game in the win over Air Force with an explosion at Rice.

#### Southern Methodist Team Report

When Navy invaded the state of Texas for its game against Rice last week, the Midshipmen ran their famed triple option to perfection, to the tune of touchdowns the first nine times they touched the ball.

Navy left Houston talking about how unprepared the Owls were for the option attack.

This week it's SMU's turn, as the Mids come back to Texas looking for another friendly host.

SMU is better than Rice. But the Mustangs are 74th in the country against the run, not a great stat when you're facing the No. 6 running team, one that is trying to win the program's fifth straight national rushing title.

#### ADVERTISEMENT

This is a huge game for June Jones' team, which really does have a chance to make a major rebuilding step this season. SMU won one game last year but enters this game Saturday night looking for its fourth win of the season, which would be two-thirds of the way to SMU's first bowl bid since 1984.

The Mustangs are 2-0 in Conference USA, the first time since 1986 that an SMU team has started conference play with a 2-0 record.

#### NOTES, QUOTES

—Amid reports former president George W. Bush will be at the game to present the trophy, Navy and SMU play for the first Frank Gansz Trophy Saturday night. Gansz played at Navy and coached at both schools. He was entering his second year as SMU's special-teams coach when he died suddenly back on April 27. “Frank Gansz touched the lives of so many players and coaches in his lifetime, not just at SMU, but throughout the nation,” said SMU head coach June Jones. “The Frank Gansz Trophy is being established to honor Frank for his contributions to the game of football and to remember all the lives he touched along the way. We are excited that we are able to establish this trophy between the two schools he loved the most, Navy and SMU. We will play this 2009 game and all future games between our two great schools in his honor.”

—WR Emmanuel Sanders continues to climb all-time receiving lists in the conference and the country. He is tied for second in the nation this season with 47 catches. He is fifth in Conference USA with 234 career catches, seventh in receiving touchdowns (29) and ninth in yards (2,980). Among active receivers around the country, he is tied for first in touchdowns, tied for third in catches per game, fourth in catches and fifth in yards.

—SMU leads the country with 13 interceptions and is second to Air Force with 19 takeaways.

—QB Bo Levi Mitchell is seventh in the country with 25.0 completions per game and is 10th in yards per game (297).

—Navy won last year's game with SMU in a driving rainstorm in Annapolis.

**SERIES HISTORY:** SMU leads, 7-6 (last meeting, 2008, Navy, 38-7).

**SCOUTING THE OFFENSE:** The SMU offense showed its explosiveness in last week's win over East Carolina, with Bo Levi Mitchell hitting Adrick Robinson with a 96-yard touchdown pass, to complement the work of the defense and special teams. The Mustangs have not been able to run the ball, however. They are 115th in the country in rushing, 15th in passing, and are 68th in total offense, 65th in scoring offense and 62nd inside the red zone.
