The Klingenstein program's goal is to offer veteran heads of school an intensive and inspirational mid-career professional development experience focusing on current educational issues, educational philosophy and ethics, and reflective practice. Throughout the program, the visiting heads engage in design thinking and case study work with Klingenstein master's students, and visit independent schools in New York City to observe a variety of programs and ideas.

Loftin, who earned a PhD in Special Education and is a certified Dyslexia Specialist, joined The Craig School as Head of School in 2020 after spending 21 years in teaching and senior administration in independent schools all while building a nationally recognized "school within a school" educational program for students with learning differences. Her keen interest in educating students with exceptionalities informs her continued professional development and growth as an educational leader as she builds upon the successes of The Craig School now and into the future.
